Goals of Research4Life Programmes (R4L)

- To connect developing world researchers with the international scientific community
- To reduce the 'publishing gap' and improve the quality of locally produced articles and journals
- To 'ensure public access to information and protect fundamental freedoms, in accordance with national legislation and international agreements' (UN Sustainable Development Goal #16)
- As of June 2018, more than 8900 institutions registered for R4L programmes


Primary Target Audiences

- Eligible categories of institutions are:
 - national universities
 - professional schools (medicine, nursing, pharmacy, public health, dentistry)
 - research institutes
 - teaching hospitals
 - government: ministries and agencies
 - national medical libraries
 - locally based non-governmental organizations (NGOs)

All permanent and visiting faculty, staff members and students are entitled to access and can obtain the institutional User Name and Password.





Passwords and registration

Institutions that would like to access full-text articles and use OARE search tools must register with OARE and receive an institutional user name and password. Upon successful completion of the registration process, all employees, staff, faculty, administrators and students of that institution should be provided the name and password so that they may access OARE resources directly. A user name and password are not required to access journal abstracts, but they are required to access the full-text articles and search tools.



- More than 1000 registered institutions. Up to 7,300 journals; 22,000 books; 25 other resources; 35 publishers' content [June 2018]



- support researchers in developing countries in creating and developing new solutions to technical challenges faced on a local and global level.











GOALI

(Global Online Access to Legal Information)

- Launched 06 March 2018, GOALI is a programme to provide free or low cost online access and training to law and law-related content to R4L eligible institutions
- The aim of GOALI is to improve the quality of legal research, education and training in these countries - to strengthen legal frameworks and institutions and further the rule of law.
- The programme initially has up to 1800 legal journals, 6900 books,
 10 other resources from 55 publishers' content included.
- Partners include the International Labour Organization (ILO), Brill Nihoff (founding publisher and initiator of the programme), Lilian Goldman Law Library at Yale University and Cornell Law School Library. (July 2018)

Key Search Tool - Summon

- All programs have access to 'Google like' Summon
 Search Tool search results include journals and books
- Almost all programs have country specific profiles that link to what the publishers grant access to in the country
- None of these tools index all the program specific Research4Life journals
- Access is at the top of the 'Content' page for all the programs; note the option to the Country specific search

If your institution is an academic, government access to the Research4Life Programmes (che Your institution might already be registered with one of the programmes. Before proceeding, please check the list of registered institutions (registered universities and professional schools) before proceeding. Please note that (1) Only one registration per programme is required per institution, and (2) More than one contact is required to register an institution. (3) Individuals are not eligible to register, only institutions. Once we review your registration, we will issue a common username and password for all staff at your institution. As Hinari, AGORA, OARE, ARDI and GOALI are in fact virtual libraries, we suggest that your institution's librarian be our main contact point. Should your institution not have a library, your director will be the main contact. Key Hints – Registration Process

- Telephone and Fax fields are numeric. No blank spaces, nor symbols should be used.
- Comments and Activities fields have a maximum number of characters (255).
- If possible, include an institutional email address (e.g. smith@kemri.org or smitha@who.int not alan.smith@gmail.com)
- Once you register for OARE, you will have access to all 5 programmes – as of March 2018.
- Lastly, the whole validation and processing takes from two to four weeks. You can check your registration by writing the Research4Life helpdesk: r4l@research4life.org

This document is a step-by-step guide to register online for the Research4Life programmes: Hinari, AGORA, OARE, ARDI and GOALI.









Following these simple guidelines will avoid problems in the registration process and ensure faster response to all registrations for the Research4Life programmes. Please review the following instructions in order to complete your registration:

HOW TO REGISTER

Now opened is the **HOW TO REGISTER** page – with specific details on the process including the List of Registered Universities and Professional Schools.

OLLOW US ON TWITTER

Before registration:

- Before filling the online form, please make sure that you have all the needed information. The more information you provide on the form, the faster we can process your registration.
- . If your institution is a UNIVERSITY or PROFESSIONAL SCHOOL, before filling the form, check the list of Registered Universities and Professional Schools. If your institution is already listed DO NOT REGISTER again. Ask at your library for the access first and then send an enquiry to the HelpDesk.
- If your account (UserID & password) has stopped working DO NOT REGISTER again, send an email to the HelpDesk explaining the problem. They will work with you to reactivate your access.
- . Do NOT FILL MULTIPLE REGISTRATIONS while you wait to hear from Research4Life. This just slows down the processing of all registrations while we check and eliminate duplicates. You may send an enquiry to the HelpDesk asking about the status of your registration.


