In 1983 Natalia graduated from the Moscow State Technical University N. Bauman, Optical and Electronic Devices Faculty and in 1986 the Russian Institute of Intellectual Property, specialty "Patent and Licensing Operations and Marketing." In 1989 she got post-graduate training at the Institute of International Economic and Political Research of the Russian Academy of Sciences with a degree of the Doctor of Economic Sciences. Natalia is the patent attorney of the Russian Federation.

Having finished post-graduation study, Natalia started to work in the position of the assistant professor at the faculty of patenting and licensing operations and marketing at the Russian Institute of Intellectual property and in 1993 Natalia established one of the first in Russia private law firm "Transtechnology", which specializes in providing a wide range of services in the field of legal protection of intellectual property and technology transfer.

Natalia is a co-owner and President of Innovation Business Club "Intelcom" created in 2003 on her initiative. The key mission of Intelcom's activity is to assist the process of formation in Russia of an efficient national innovation system, strengthening of legal mechanisms of protection of intellectual property, commercialisation of technologies and attraction of investments into science-based sector of economy.

From January 2005 Natalia runs the Committee of Innovation Development and Intellectual Property of the All-Russian Organization of Small and Medium-Sized Entrepreneurship OPORA RUSSIA and is the Vice-President of this organization.

Natalia has more than 20 years of experience in the field of intellectual property, technology transfer, public-private partnership for innovation.
